First of all, there is the city centre, which is pretty much where you might be spending most of your time in town. This is where the Roman Baths and the Abbey (both of which you have probably heard about) are located. From the Roman Baths you can walk up and down the shopping centre streets for a bit and branch out towards Great Pulteney Bridge and the River Avon which runs underneath. There are a lot of restaurants to enjoy in Bath, all from various national backgrounds.
