Programme Overview

This programme meets the needs of students planning careers in the legal sector as well as those pursuing other professions or further study.

If you are an aspiring lawyer, the programme is specifically designed to help prepare you for the SRA's Solicitors Qualifying Examinations, as well as meeting Bar Standards Board and CILEX requirements. The programme will help you develop professional skills and allow you to explore other fields through modules in complementary subjects. We'll also encourage you to take periods away from University on a professional practice placement (not available at William College).

The programme is highly applied. In the first year, you will have the opportunity to develop a solid foundation of legal knowledge and intellectual and professional skills, which you will further develop and refine in your second and third years. In the first and second years you will also have the opportunity to reflect on your development and the extent to which you are meeting your academic and professional objectives so that, in your final year, you focus your efforts on achieving those goals upon graduation.

Whatever your goals and choices, you will join a collegiate academic community that champions lifelong learning, supported by research- and practice-informed teaching.

(Students who take the modules noted with ^, below, will earn a degree which is accredited by the Bar Standards Board as the ‘academic component’ for the purposes of qualifying for the bar of England & Wales. The single-honours degree will exempt students from the requirements of Associate Member of CILEX, although direct application will be necessary.)

5. Craft confident, lifelong learners who seek out and exploit new opportunities that challenge and further themselves.

Assessment methods

A range of summative assessment tasks will be used to test the Intended Learning Outcomes in each module. These are indicated in the attached assessment map which shows which tasks are used in which modules.

Students will be supported in their development towards summative assessment by appropriate formative exercises.

Please note: if you choose an optional module from outside this programme, you may be required to undertake a summative assessment task that does not appear in the assessment grid here in order to pass that module.

Work experience and placement opportunities

In almost all cases, you will be encouraged to take placement opportunities. These can be in any relevant position, in legal practice (independently, or in an industry setting) or in related fields (e.g. governance; human resources; finance; courts or prison services; social welfare organisations).

Whilst you are welcome to engage in extra-curricular placements (that is, those arranged beyond the scope of your degree), there are two placement modules to support you if you wish to earn credits for your placement activities:

1. Open 'Work Placement' Module (BMA5120): *4 weeks work experience during your second year, which attracts 20, Level-5 credits.*

This is a Level-5 open module run by Bath Business School offering comprehensive support to gain a short work experience opportunity.

1. Professional Placement Year: *10-month placement between your second and third years, which attracts 120, Level-5 'placement' credits.*

If you are enrolled on the single honours Law Programme, an option for part of your programme will be to obtain and complete a 10-month period with an approved employer. This period will be completed after Level 5 and before Level 6 and will run from September/October to June/July. Towards the end of the first year, there will be a meeting arranged to explain the Professional Placement Year process. Details will be sent to all Level 4 Law students. The core modules at Level 5 will provide time and guidance for you to apply and prepare for the full-length placement.

Note that students wishing to practice as a solicitor will be required to complete 2 years' qualifying work experience before admission as a solicitor. See <https://www.sra.org.uk/sra/policy/sqe/solicitor-persona.page> for details.
