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Programme Overview

The MA in Professional Practice is designed for busy professionals who wish to develop their practice in a way that suits their working circumstances. It is aimed at those new to the profession as well as those who are experienced in their field. Participants can choose from a variety of modules which enable them to recognise and defend good professional practice and to become competent in analysing, evaluating and restructuring their practice through engagement with evidence-based practice and research.

Full-time and part-time students are given 2 trimesters to complete 30 credits.

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Programme Aims

1. To advance personal teaching and professional understanding through engagement in a series of modules applicable to professional and teaching circumstances
2. To provide qualified teachers with opportunities to engage in professional development activity that is accredited academically and recognised internationally
3. To enable participants to plan and conduct an in-depth study of a topic which has professional relevance for them and contributes to their growth as a teaching professional
4. To have the opportunity to apply the perspectives and paradigms from a range of other award pathways to their understanding of education
5. To facilitate students' critical thinking and analysis of education in a contemporary context
6. To act as preparation for doctoral study

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Assessment methods

A range of summative assessment tasks will be used to test the Intended Learning Outcomes in each module. These are indicated in the attached assessment map which shows which tasks are used in which modules.

Students will be supported in their development towards summative assessment by appropriate formative exercises.

Please note: if you choose an optional module from outside this programme, you may be required to undertake a summative assessment task that does not appear in the assessment grid here in order to pass that module.

Work experience and placement opportunities

If you are currently employed as an educational professional, many of the learning tasks and assessments set during your award can be adapted to being undertaken within your professional context. Most pathways will include visiting speakers from and visits to a range of educational contexts; however there is no requirement for you to undertake work experience or placements during your studies. Whilst there are no specific work experience or placement opportunities incorporated into this course there will be opportunities to reflect on professional experience and to discuss real life situations within the seminars. It may be possible for informal visits to be arranged to visit schools and / or other educational settings.

There is a placement for TES7102 Theory and Practice of TESOL. Initially placement in schools will involve observation with tasks relating the observation to what is covered in class. Students may be invited to assist teachers in class or may, depending on the placement context, be given responsibility for a class, or task within a class. The opportunities offered by placements will differ for each student depending on the setting and the student's own language teaching experience. Students will complete Observation Reflection forms or Teaching Reflection forms as appropriate each week; these will form the basis for either discussion in class, feedback sessions or assessment tasks. Placement settings are varied and include: Primary schools, Secondary schools, Private language schools, Third level and Further Education colleges. We aim to place students in a setting that closely relates to their career aspirations and development needs, but this is dependent on sufficient placements being available.
