Programme Overview

BA (Hons) Acting for Screen trains you to be an imaginative, technically skilful and employable actor. The programme has strong industry connections and is, in part, based at The Bottle Yard Film and TV Studios where you can gain experience of industry level practice and practitioners. You also work with boomsatsuma BA Games Art students, allowing you to experience leading edge VR techniques.

The programme offers a cohesive approach in which movement, acting class and voice are fully integrated to ensure your craft is flexible enough to allow you to develop a personal process but singular enough to offer an in-depth exploration of the art of acting for screen as a specific discipline.

Level 4 introduces you to the core principles that underpin the training: the development of your voice, movement and acting skills. The course also introduces you to the history of screen acting and the techniques of preparing for a role in TV and film as well as the technical demands of the studio.

At level 5 you explore advanced acting voice and movement techniques which prepare you for the film production that takes place at level 5. You also take a module in self-scripting that engages you in finding your voice as a creative artist and creating your own stories.

Level 6 further develops your professional practice from comedy to working with new technologies including VR. You work towards appearing in a professionally produced film as well as being supported to prepare for employment with classes in self-taping, audition technique and self-marketing. A showcase screening for agents, where possible in London, supports your career progression.

The programme equips you with the essential technical and creative skills required of a working screen actor, motivated artist and independent thinker as well as the critical thinking and research skills required by postgraduate study.

1. To provide a relevant, diverse and challenging programme that develops the practical and creative skills at the forefront of screen actor training
2. To develop your creative, critical, analytical and interpersonal skills as a screen actor in a range of settings and contexts
3. To foster your ability to select, refine and effectively engage appropriate skills and processes of screen acting in a range of performance genres
4. To optimise critical and analytical engagement with theoretical perspectives of performance and their application to practice through a rigorous programme of study
5. To prepare you for a career in screen acting by offering industry-focused support that complements and enhances entrepreneurship and proactive engagement with the cultural industries
6. To improve your career opportunities by developing an acute awareness of the depth and range of transferable subject specific skills applicable to fluctuating and evolving employment scenarios and lifelong learning
7. To develop your ability to assess and manage risk, health and safety and to employ ethical working practices

Work experience and placement opportunities

With regard to BA (Hons) Acting for Screen, it is important to note that Equity, the UK trade union for professional performers and creative practitioners, does not permit students to undertake any formal work experience or placement as a professional actor before graduation. However, the entirety of the programme has been designed to focus on engaging students in live projects that replicate the demands of the professional workplace environment. The programme's partnership with institutions such as The Bottle Yard Studios is designed to create a space for performance research and development based on an exchange between the professional artists and companies using the studios and the students training there. In addition, *boomsatsuma* provides excellent opportunities for developing your professional profile and expanding your networks via our strong existing relationships with numerous creative initiatives across the South-West.
