

This is your Swatchlet — a pocket-sized creative tool you can print, cut, and carry with you.

Print it in colour on thick paper or card if you can (recycled paper looks lovely too).

Then:

- Cut along the crop marks
- Hole-punch the corner
- Thread it onto a keyring, ribbon, or lanyard

Now you've got your own mini colour companion.

Take it outside, flip through the cards, and let colour guide your next creative spark.

Each Swatchlet card has two sides.

One side shows a colour.

and the other shows a picture.



I choose a card, then spot its colour or image in the world wherever I am. I take photos of anything that matches my card,

Like purple things if I pick the Parma Violet card.



My favourite thing to make is collages.

I use the photos I've taken and cut and stick them to make something magical.



You can use them to do anything creative you like.

You could do drawing, writing, songwriting, movement, photography, model making or whatever you want! If you're struggling with what to do here are some prompts that might help you!

Think about what the cards sound like -'Alien Slime' for example

Describe a smell that matches a colour nearby.

Try to move your body to match the objects you find.

Write a story that includes the coloured objects you find

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
